Florida law provides that public agencies, including the University of Central Florida, must notify individuals of the circumstances that would require the collection and use of social security numbers. Section 119.071(5) of the Florida Statutes provides that a public agency in the state of Florida may collect and use the SSN where the agency is specifically authorized by law to do so or where it is imperative for the performance of the agency's duties and responsibilities as prescribed by law.

The UCF Statement of Collection and Use of Social Security Numbers, below, outlines specific reasons that an individual may be asked for their SSN by the University and identifies the authority for that collection. For example, any individual that wishes to be employed by the University must provide a valid SSN for payroll and tax purposes, as required by federal tax law.

## UCF STATEMENT OF COLLECTION AND USE OF SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS

The following are the general scenarios under which UCF will collect and use social security numbers:

To minimize the use of SSNs in campus operations, UCF assigns each employee and student a unique university-generated identification number (PID) for use in day-to-day operations.

SSN's are otherwise confidential and will be securely maintained. SSN's will not be disclosed for any other reasons unless required by law or a court order.
